2013 Science ICAS (International Competitions and Assessments for Schools) Results – $44 \times 10^{-5} \times 10^{-8}$ Students sat the ICAS Science test last term. 21 Students received Participation Awards, 18 received Credit Awards (top 35%), 3 received Distinction (top 10%) and 2 received High Distinction (top 1%). This is an outstanding result when you consider that it is the top echelon of students who sit these tests. Students who received Distinction were Tui Denee (Yr.5), George Powell (Yr.7), Maggie Booker (Yr.8), and the students who received High Distinction were Hannah Mercer (Yr.5) and Rose Hurst (Yr.6) – absolutely stunning. Congratulations to all participants.

SUSHI RECIPE

Cook one cup of rice according to directions on packet.

Prepare vegetables; carrot, cucumber, capsicum, avocado, by washing and cutting into long thin strips.

Cool rice when cooked.

Spread rice over 1 sheet of Nori which is placed on a bamboo rolling mat.

Place a row of vegetables across the centre of the rice.

Can top with canned tuna, salmon or other cooked fish if desired.

Roll the seaweed into a tight roll to enclose the filling using the bamboo mat to help.

Place the sushi roll into the fridge till ready to eat.

Cut into 6 small pieces

Serve with a dipping sauce ie Sweet Chilli, soy sauce,...

Which rice should I use? Sushi rice is expensive. Use short grain rice or medium grain rice. Both are sticky when cooked and perfect for sushi.
