ICAS Examination entries for Students in Years 5 to 8 - ICAS (International Competitions and Assessments for Schools) are Australian examinations created by EAA (Educational Assessment Australia). They are independent tests that sit outside of our learning programs, and are not aligned to New Zealand curriculum levels. Many schools invite their able students to take part in the assessments, and they are generally seen as an extension activity. We would like to provide the opportunity for any students to sit them, if they wish. The ICAS website has further information regarding ICAS exams.

Students in Year 5 to 8 can opt into any of the ICAS examinations below (with parent agreement). There is a cost of \$10 for sitting each exam. Plimmerton School will be offering the following for Years 5 to 8 in 2018:

Exam Subject Sitting Date

Science Tuesday 29 May English Tuesday 31 July Mathematics Tuesday 14 August

Every student who enters the ICAS receives a certificate acknowledging their results, as follows:

High Distinction Certificate the top 1% of participants

Distinction Certificate the next 10% of participants

Credit Certificate the next 25% of participants

Merit Certificate the next 10% of participants

Participation Certificate all remaining participants

Certificates are accompanied with an analysis of the entrants score.

Before each actual test date there will be a pre-exam session to help students entering to familiarize themselves with the test procedure and to answer any concerns they might have. Students will also try some questions from exams from previous years.

To enter your child/ren for any ICAS exams this year, please complete the form at this <u>link</u>. Registration will be closing on Tuesday 24 April. Please also be aware that we cannot refund any entry fees after that date, even if your child is then absent on the examination day.


