#### **RAIL SAFETY WEEK**

It is Rail Safety Week again, an annual event beginning 13th - 19th August. This year's campaign finds a simple way to remind people to look for trains, whenever they're near a railway crossing. The messages are intended to stick in people's minds and prompt them in the moment to put this action into practice.

The increased roll out of electric trains in Wellington, means messages of staying alert and focused need to be emphasised. It is more difficult to hear these trains as they run quietly. We are fortunate to have barriers, and bell alarms at the Plimmerton level crossing. This initiative targets pedestrians using headphones or smartphones.


#### The message for Healthy Kids:

- To expect trains at any time, from any direction.
- Look left, look right for trains.
- Use the underpass to get across the tracks.
- Walk quickly across the train platform, holding your ball in your hand and walking your scooter well away from the yellow line.
- Always obey warning signs at a level crossing.
- If a train has passed or is stationary at a station, always check both ways again to make sure another train is not coming. Two tracks might mean there is a second train.
- Remove headphones around railway tracks.
- Only cross if there are no trains in sight.
- It is encouraged that people do not hoodies with their hoods up near tracks that may impede their awareness of approaching trains.

TrackStoppers: A social media video was produced to encourage people to cross safely at level crossings. The film was made at the Epuni level crossing in Wellington and involved well-known New Zealand band Drax Project. The band performed by the side of the level crossing as pedestrians approached and stopped playing as they started crossing. The concept promoted the idea that pedestrians should stay alert and focus on their surroundings when using a level crossing by removing their headphones. Cameras captured the band setting up and playing, as well as people's reactions to the band.

To get the most out of the app features we do recommend creating an account so you can easily manage the content the school sends through.

To create an account, go to the side menu via the top-left corner and click on "Log-in". This is a quick and easy process that will require your first and last name, and a mobile number, email, or Facebook account authorisation. Once you have created your account, you will be able to access all of the new app features which will be highlighted in the welcome video.
