## Mai e te Tumuaki - From the Principal

Kia ora e te whānau,

Since the last newsletter we have managed to celebrate so many great things... including some sun! Not only did we get to watch two heats of "Plimmerton's Got Talent" but we also came together as a school to raise money for the Wellington Free Ambulance via "Onesie Day." One of our lovely parents from Moana Road generously donated three "Onesies" and three super lucky winners' names were pulled out of a hat - congratulations to Sophie, Isabella-Rose and Chase and thank you again to Moana Rd.



In the spirit of celebrating I also pulled out the names of three lucky students Macklan, Tai and Vai who received a hot chocolate and a chat with me at one of our local cafe's! Lucky them:)





In the last newsletter, I shared 5 questions to ask your child at the end of each day. The aim was to promote positive talk around the table and for children to understand that school is not always about being right. Importantly, school is about taking risks, making mistakes, growing, and becoming resilient. All traits that align with our school values of Manawa Tītī (We are resilient), Whitireiatanga (We aim high), Kaitiakitanga (We look after our place), and Manaakitanga (We are kind). The reason I talk about our values is because generally, at this time of the year our tamariki are tired, have been cooped up due to the rain and their patience wears quite thin.

So today's theme is about Respect. According to Michael Grose, a leading parenting and educational writer, author of nine books, and speaker respect starts well before your child makes it to school each day, and he has some great advice to support whanau and I thought would share three key things:

TEACH THEM TO TREAT OTHERS WELL: Sometimes it's not what we say, but what we don't say that makes all the difference. Insist brothers and sisters treat each other well. Listen to the language they use and insist they don't become personal - focus on the behaviour, not the person. It is important that we don't let disrespectful behaviour go unchallenged.

LOOK AND LISTEN: As a parent or carer it's important to be aware of how young people interact with each other. Be prepared to challenge negative and disrespectful attitudes, but also be mindful that your children's attitudes mirror those of people they respect, which can be confronting when you don't like what you hear.

PROVIDE KIDS WITH THE RIGHT SKILLS: Help young people give voice to their concerns constructively, fairly and assertively. Coach your sons to ask for what they want and to express frustration properly. Mentor your daughters to stand up for themselves when they feel disrespected or unsafe. These build trust and will ultimately bring you closer together.

Some great life lessons that we can all take something from.

#### AIMS Games

Earlier in the week swimmers Lola, Freddie and Asher attended the Zespri AIMS Games in Tauranga. The Zespri AIMS Games gives 11, 12 & 13 year olds an opportunity to compete as an individual or a team against other children their age in 23 codes. There were 10,000 children competing from 120 schools.

There were 400 Year 7 and 8 swimmers entered and our swimmers had some fantastic results. Asher got a gold in the 50m breaststroke and broke his Wellington record. He also came 4th in the 100m breaststroke and 5th in the 200m breaststroke. Freddy came 4th in the 50m breaststroke and 5th in the 200m backstroke. In the 200m individual medley he came 5th and in the 100m individual medley he came 9th. Lola entered 8 different events and came in the top 20 in all her events.

## Out Of Zone Places For 2022

At the last board of trustees meeting it was agreed that there are unlikely to be any out of zone places for students in 2023. This is in line with the board's decision not to take out of zone students from 2022.

To be clear about what this means for families who currently live outside the school zone:

- Any students who are already attending school will not be affected.
- Any younger brothers or sisters not yet at school who were offered an out of zone placement for this year will not be affected and can still enrol.
- Any younger brothers or sisters not yet at school, who will start school in 2023 or future years, will not be able to enrol at Plimmerton School.

The board has to make long term preparations for the increased roll growth expected from the Plimmerton Farm and Grays Farm developments. The Ministry of Education has been clear that they expect our school to accommodate a further 250+ students in the short to medium term before they will consider opening a new school. When the Ministry assesses a school's capacity to decide if extra classrooms are needed, it does not count any out of zone students. As students attend the school for eight years we need to maintain the process of reducing out of zone numbers now. This is the best way we can prepare the school for what is coming.

#### In Zone Enrolments For 2023 & Student Leavers

It is that time of year when we start to plan for the number of classes in each syndicate for next year. Having a clear picture of 'arrivers and leavers' helps us to keep classes to an appropriate size.

**Do you have a child starting school in 2023?** To pre-enrol your child (or check if they are already pre-enrolled) please contact the school office or go to the enrolment page of the school website. If you know of any friends or family in our zone who may not have pre-enrolled their child please encourage them to contact us too.

Do you have a child (Year 1 to Year 7) leaving our school during, or at the end of 2022? Please advise the school office so that we can prepare the appropriate transfer information.

#### **School Donation**

The school donation is voluntary, but any donation makes a huge difference in what we can offer our students. A BIG THANK YOU to those families who have already made donations, we are extremely grateful for your support! If you would like to make a donation but are yet to do so, please read on for further information and for easy payment options.

In line with the government donation scheme the suggested donation this year is \$150 per student. As it is a donation the amount is up to you and voluntary. If this amount is a stretch feel free to adjust it accordingly. At the same time if you feel you could contribute more, please also feel free to adjust the amount. The school office will generate a tax receipt for any donation amount of which you can then claim 1/3 back from the IRD.

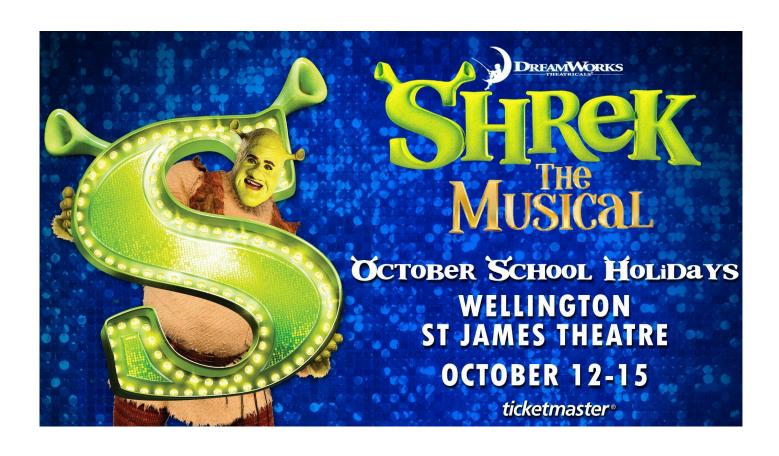

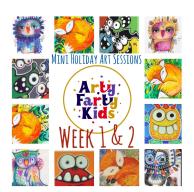
