From the Board of Trustees

Our Plimmerton Farm Submission

The Board of Trustees has made a submission to the Porirua City Council on the proposal to rezone Plimmerton Farm for property development (<u>Proposed Plan Change 18</u>).

Our submission states:

"We oppose the provisions due to the lack of clarity around future schooling provision. Plimmerton School currently has approximately 1800 households in our zone resulting in a current school role of 500. Plimmerton Farm proposes to add an additional 2000 households to the Plimmerton School zone with no plan in place as to how the additional students will be catered for.

Recent experience of the effect the Aotea development had on Papakowhai school have given us grave cause for concern. Papakowhai School doubled in size over a period of 10 years with an average increase of 30 students per annum. The school had students learning in the hall, a significant reduction in play area, huge traffic management issues and the challenge of safely managing a constant building site year after year as the Ministry of Education played catch up.

We seek the following decision:

A commitment to resolve schooling capacity issues before the district plan change is approved. The recent experience of the Aotea subdivision and the effect it had on Papakowhai School demonstrates the risk of proceeding without the council accepting responsibility for resolving this issue before proceeding."

Early this week a sub-committee met with the Ministry of Education to discuss our concerns as part of a wider conversation started about a year ago. We will continue to meet with the Ministry on the issue of Plimmerton Farm and the effect it will have on Plimmerton School and will keep you updated.
