From the Principal

Kia ora e te whānau,

Today in our Assembly 70 students received a values certificate. This was acknowledgement of how well and consistently that they had demonstrated one of our school values over the last three weeks. We also celebrated that over 600 values cards had been given out to students over the last three weeks. These are an on the spot recognition of behaviour that reflects our values. The redefining of our school values, and the ways of promoting them are an important part of the 'Positive Behaviour for Learning' (PB4L) project that we are a part of along with many other schools. Another important initiative in this project has been developing a support space and system for students to help guide them when things don't quite go right! See more on that below...

TE RUMA O TAUTOKO (SUPPORT ROOM)

Tautoko means to support, encourage, back, accept, agree.

Te Ruma o Tautoko is a room that has been set up in the school so that students can access support from a teacher, at interval and lunchtime to deal with issues that arise in the playground.

There is a process and shared expectations about how students will participate in the Tautoko Room so that everyone is listened to and gets a chance to speak. The teacher from the leadership team, who is rostered to be on duty, will invite students to tell them what happened so what has happened can be understood by everyone. Together students, with the teacher's support, will reflect on the incident and the behaviour choices made at the time. To move forward, the teacher will then help the student or group of students, to acknowledge the feelings of all involved, and come to an agreement on what they could do differently in the future and which of our school values they could show next time. Where necessary, there will be an agreed 'make good' action or natural consequence.

We are encouraging students to see going to Te Ruma o Tautoko as a learning experience. It is not the "naughty room" but as the definition suggests a place to go where children can feel supported and encouraged, where they can consider their choices and those of others, and have some control in solving issues and planning for more positive interactions that will enable themselves and others to live the school values in the future.

PLEASE HELP US TO BE SMOKEFREE AT SCHOOL

The Smoke-free Environments Act 1990 directs that all school buildings and grounds are smokefree, 24 hours a day, seven days a week (with no exemptions). The education provisions in the Act aim to:

- prevent the exposure of children and young people to second-hand smoke,
- prevent children and young people being influenced by seeing others smoke,
- send a positive message about a smokefree lifestyle as the norm.

The Act applies to anyone on the school grounds, including students, staff, visiting parents, contractors, and people hiring or using the school facilities outside school hours. This applies to all smoking and vaping products, including e-cigarettes.

SCHOOL DISCOS NEXT WEEK - POSTPONED

The PTA School discos were scheduled for Friday next week. These have been postponed. A new date to be advised soon.

SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR

The Scholastic book fair has been a great success. As a result of our sales we have earned scholastic vouchers to the value of over \$2,000. These vouchers will be redeemed for books for Te Korowai Manaaki - the new library. Thank you to the student council and our librarian Liz Nichols for running the fair, and to all the parents and students who supported this by purchasing books.

CHILLED - A STORY WITH A WARM MESSAGE

The New Zealand Playhouse will be performing their show "Chilled" at school on Monday. The show's objectives are to educate and inspire students about Antarctica, encourage and foster a love of science and the natural world and learn about climate change.

PARUMOANA CROSS-COUNTRY RACES

ROAD SAFETY: STUDENTS CROSSING BETWEEN MOANA ROAD TO SUNSET PARADE

The traffic moves very swiftly along the parade, making crossing to and from Moana Road (the cutting) quite hazardous. If your child crosses here please make sure they know how to manage the road crossing. We have requested that the council consider some measures to make it clear to drivers that children are likely to cross at that point. RAIL SAFETY WEEK 10-16 AUGUST - CROSS WITH CARE | KIA TŪPATO TE WHAKAWHITI

Rail Safety Week aims to reduce near miss collisions on level crossings. Every near miss is a traumatic event and has a very real impact on the locomotive engineers, the witnesses involved and on those who nearly lost their lives. Never cross when bells or lights are activated and always look carefully in both directions before crossing. Be especially careful to look for a second train. If one train has stopped at a station another one could be coming. We recommend that you show your child/ren this <u>video on crossing railway tracks safely</u>.
