Dear Parents and Carers,

We welcome students and families back to the final term of the year! We want you to be kept well informed about what is happening in your child's class and the syndicate. Please don't hesitate to contact your child's teacher at any stage to check what's happening.

HONGOEKA LEARNING

Below is an outline of what we will be learning, so that you can support your child with their learning at home.

- Writing: Weeks 1-6 is speech writing oral language techniques, planning, writing and presenting a speech.
- Maths: Algebra (number patterns, expressions and sequences). Children will also be revising addition, subtraction, multiplication and division strategies.
- Reading: Plays Students will be working in small groups to look at the features of plays and interactions of characters. They will be working together to practise and perform their play.
- **P.E** Swimming and small ball skills.
- Health Week 1 Week 3, Digital Citizenship and body changes. This is to finish off the health that was not covered last term.
- Science Week 4 Week 8, we will be exploring the material world and the nature of science. Each week students will take part in a science experiment. They will make predictions, record observations and learn the science behind the experiment.

Speeches

In weeks 1 to 4, students will write and deliver a speech topic of their choice to their class. The speech will be about something they are already very familiar with, as this is not a research project. Students are expected to **write the speech themselves** at school.

To support students with writing their speech, we will work on skills to improve planning, drafting, and editing. We ask that you do not write or edit your child's speech for them.

In order to prepare students for delivering their speeches, they will take part in a range of oral language activities and will also analyse other people's speeches to identify what an effective speech looks like.

Please support your child by talking with them about possible speech ideas, listening to your child's speech and feeding back to them how they could improve their delivery.

Use of Chromebooks:

Chromebooks are used in Hongoeka to support learning. A reminder that during school times these should be used only for learning in class. If you need to send a message to your child, please go through the office. As a syndicate, we teach children about what it means to be a good digital citizen and we encourage students to be good digital citizens.

Swimming

Please encourage your child to participate in swimming this term, week 3 and weeks 6, 7 & 8 Our focus in swimming this term is water safety. If you have any milk bottles, rope, life jackets (please name) or any other flotation devices we could borrow, please send them along to school by week 3 so we can use them.
