Swimming:

We will have swimming and water safety in **weeks 3, 6, 7 and 8** of this term. Swimming is part of the Physical Education curriculum so please encourage your child to bring their togs during these weeks. Please email your child's teacher if they are not able to swim.

Physical Education

As well as swimming, the children will be taking part in athletics and summer sports lessons. These are on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Please encourage your child to wear appropriate clothing and footwear. If your child is not able to take part in a PE lesson please email their class teacher and let them know.

All students are expected to fully participate in the Taupō sports programme. We will contact parents if students repeatedly choose to opt out of sport time.

Snorkelling: Weather permitting:)

In week 8 each class will be doing a ½ day snorkel at either Taputeranga Marine Reserve or Pukerua Bay with Mountain to Sea Wellington. Prior to this Mountain to Sea Wellington will be taking class sessions focussing on marine biodiversity, marine reserves, human impacts and taking action. Each class will also have a session at Te Rauparaha Arena learning how to use the snorkelling equipment. The cost of this will be approx \$40 per child. Please keep an eye out for the notice coming out in the next couple of weeks.

Taupō Spring Tramp

This year we will walk the Ōrongorongo Track which is the most popular walk in the Remutaka Forest Park. It consists of a 4 hour round trip with a swim in the Turere Stream during a lunch break. It's an easy grade and makes for a pleasant day trip to the Ōrongorongo Valley.

Homework

Homework is posted into the homework google classroom at the beginning of each fortnight. It is up to the children to manage their time and get it completed. At the end of each fortnight students need to upload evidence of the following to their homework google classroom site by 9am:

Sun Smart Policy:

Students need to bring a brimmed hat and wear it whenever they are outside this term. Sorry, **NO** caps allowed:)

Brain Break:

During the morning students have an opportunity to have a short snack and water break. Food eaten during this time <u>must</u> be healthy and could include - fruit, vegetables or nuts. Other snacks should be kept for interval and lunch times.

Chromebooks:

Children need to ensure that their chromebook is fully recharged prior to coming to school as they are unable to recharge them during school time.

Phones:

Students are expected to turn phones off and put them away in their bags as soon as they arrive at school in the morning. They can get it out at 3pm to organise meeting up with parents or other family members.

<u>If you need to contact your child during school hours please ring the school office.</u> They will put you through to the classroom.

If phones are seen or heard during school hours they will be sent to the office where they can be collected by the student at the end of the day.
