From the Principal

Kia ora e te whānau,

Welcome to term 4. We hope you all had a lovely break exploring the great things our own backyard has to offer. PINK SHIRT DAY

Tomorrow is Pink Shirt Day. Across New Zealand people will be wearing pink and joining together to "speak up, stand together and stop bullying." We are encouraging students and staff to wear pink tomorrow to support this important message. Many classes will be taking part in activities around this theme.

PB4L - POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR FOR LEARNING

VALUES BEHAVIOUR

Plimmerton School is in our second year of implementing Positive Behaviour for Learning (PB4L). Positive Behaviour for Learning aims to provide a positive school climate and to create a supportive environment for personal, social and academic growth for students and staff.

Our students are focussing on our school values:

Whitireiatanga - We aim high

Manawa Titi - We are resilient

Manaakitanga - We are kind

Kaitiakitanga - We look after our place.

To support students in doing this teachers have identified behaviours for the whole school to focus on over a fortnight so that we do have a positive school climate and create a supportive environment.

In the last four weeks of Term 3 we focussed on:

- Following instructions
- Moving around the school.

This fortnight we are focussing on Being aware of others and being aware of our surroundings

We would really appreciate the support of parents in implementing our values behaviour. You could do this by discussing what it looks and sounds like, with your child and encouraging them to demonstrate the behaviours that will create a positive school climate and create a supportive environment at Plimmerton School.



SUNSMART

In Term 4 all children should have a named sunhat. Sunhats need to provide sun protection to the ears, neck and face. Bucket hats, legionnaire caps or "cricket"-style hats are all suitable. Students without a hat will remain in shade areas during intervals. Suitable hats are available at the office for \$18. This can be added to your student account.

We also encourage students to drink plenty of fluid during this term; even bringing an extra water bottle can be a good idea. Keeping well hydrated helps prevent sunstroke, heat exhaustion and, most importantly, improves concentration!

TEACHER ONLY DAYS THIS TERM

This is a reminder of two teacher only days scheduled for this term. These will be held on:

CLASS PLACEMENTS FOR NEXT YEAR

During this term we will be making up class lists for next year. We will be working hard to ensure that we have balanced classes in each area of the school. Positive learning relationships will be considered in this process. We are unable to consider requests for placements with friends or for specific teachers. Parents are requested not to contact me or any teacher to request placement of a child with a friend or with a particular teacher. Parents are welcome to contact me before the end of November if they wish to discuss any other additional needs that they think we may not be aware of and they would like considered in relation to the placement of their child. Students will be told who their teacher for next year will be on Monday 14 December and they will go to their new room and spend some time with their new teacher (where possible) and new classmates.

From the Board

PLIMMERTON FARM AND THE FUTURE FOR OUT OF ZONE PLACES

The plan change process for the planned Plimmerton Farm subdivision on the Cambourne side of State Highway One is continuing. Today Mike Forrest and a board representative spoke at the hearing in support of the school's submission.

The concerns we have are:

- 1. There is no confirmed schooling provision planned for Plimmerton Farm. The Ministry are currently looking into purchasing land for a school, and they have indicated to us that a new school is likely. This does not mean a school will be built.
- 2. There is no transition plan. If a new school is built, then Plimmerton School will need to accommodate an increased number of students while the number of students required for a new school to be built arrive and then once this happens while the school is built. This number is estimated to be an additional 300-400 students. This level of roll growth would put huge pressure on the existing school facilities.
- 3. Traffic management issues around the school at pick up and drop off times, particularly with the increased number of students.

While we are pleased with the understanding and empathy that we are receiving from the Porirua City Council and the Ministry of Education we remain deeply troubled by the lack of plan. We will continue to keep you updated.

In light of this issue the board has made the tough decision to not take any out of zone enrolments for the 2022 school year. The reason for this decision is that when the Ministry of Education assesses a school's capacity to decide if extra classrooms are needed, it does not count any out of zone students. As students attend the school for eight years we need to start the process of reducing out of zone numbers now. This is the best way we can prepare the school for what is coming.

We understand this news will be difficult for some of our families who are living out of zone, as it will have an impact for any of their preschool children who are siblings of current students. The board made the decision to bring this into effect from 2022 to give affected families some time to plan.

PTA News

Kia ora e te whānau

The PTA as usual is working hard in the background to keep earning the extra funds that keep our school running. This year has been a challenging environment to fundraise in with event restrictions and cancellations. It has been tough on us all and on the school finances!

The PTA has been working with the school to make a plan for the gala. Each year the gala has set up costs. These costs are comfortably covered by the profits earned on the day. This year with the risk of restrictions or even cancellation it doesn't feel prudent to spend this money in advance, as there is a risk the PTA could actually end up losing money. So this year we will be doing things a little differently.

Monster Garage Sale

This will be held on Saturday 21 November. The Monster Garage sale will combine the white elephant, children and adults clothing stalls, toy stall, plants stall and book stall into a bargain bazaar held in the hall and neighbouring classrooms. Bargain hunters will be able to replenish themselves at the coffee cart, sausage sizzle and snack shop.

The aim is to make some money for the school from an event that can go ahead at level 1 or 2 and does not carry the risk of incurring debt if cancelled at level 3.

School Day Fun Fair

This will be held on a school day in term four. It will be a day for some good old fashioned fun. There will be activities on the field run by staff and students, traditional picnic games and some exciting surprises for kids of all

ages. The aim is to give students a chance to blow off some steam and have some fun after an uncertain and challenging year. This event will also be designed to go ahead at level 1 or 2.

The focus of the School Day Fun Fair is for students to have fun. We will need to cover our costs but are not aiming to make money out of this event. There will be a couple of optional fundraising activities that students will be able to participate in such as the jaffa roll, lucky keys and a sausage sizzle.

WHAT WE NEED:

Goods to sell - start putting aside your good quality items for us to sell.

Volunteers - for the monster garage sale to help run the stalls on the day and to help sort donated goods the week prior.

Sponsorship - both for the Monster Garage Sale and for Fun Fair prizes. The PTA will not be approaching business directly this year as we are conscious that this has been a hard year for a lot of businesses.
