Vaping has now become prohibited at schools and early childcare centres. This includes inside all buildings and all parts of the school grounds at all times. This came into force this week as part of the <u>Smokefree Environments and</u> <u>Regulated Products (Vaping) Amendment Act 2020.</u> New smokefree signage that also includes vaping will be available for schools to install sometime early next year.


