- Christmas Concert The school End of Year concert will be held on Wednesday 9th December at 6pm. This will be on the courts and turf, with the library deck as the stage area. Families are invited to have a picnic on the field or the courts from 5pm onwards and students will be asked to go to their designated areas at 5.45pm.
