BUYING YOUR CHILD A PHONE OR DEVICE THIS CHRISTMAS?

The day a child gets their first phone or device is a milestone - one that many parents dread! Yet, unlike some other milestones in a young person's life, there is no set age at which it is most appropriate to give a child a smartphone or computer; this could vary significantly from family to family. There is a lot of evidence to suggest that holding off until children are older can benefit their well-being. Many parents are doing this so don't necessarily buy into your child's argument "that everyone else has one!"

If you do think the time is right we recommend families take the time to sit down together and establish a set of 'First Phone/Device Guidelines'. I especially recommend <u>this online tool</u> to establish an agreement with your child.

We do make it an option for parents to purchase a chromebook for their child from Year 5 and up. Please don't feel under pressure to do this. The school has a supply of devices that can be allocated to students or shared in classes. In light of the advice above you may wish to wait until your child is a little older and has shown that they are a responsible device user.

For those parents that do feel that their child is responsible enough to have their own chromebook for home and school use, the Norrcom purchasing portal is available at this <u>link</u>. Note - the passcode for the portal is plim09. There are four device options that are robust, fit for purpose and good value. The current cost for the devices is between \$350 and \$450 including gst. There will also be options for:

- Insurance
- Extended 3 year warranty
- Carry bag

Orders can be collected from the school office at the end of January - you will receive an email to confirm your device is ready for collection. Your device will be connected to the school network as part of the purchase.

LAST DAY TOMORROW

- Final School Assembly: Leavers' Poroporoaki Our final assembly will be held tomorrow at 11:00am. This is traditionally our most formal occasion of the year and will be attended by the Board of Trustees and a great number of parents. The assembly usually takes around an hour and the occasion is used to officially farewell our Year 8 students and other leavers. In Level 1 all parents and friends of the school are very welcome to attend.
- School finishes at 12 noon tomorrow School will finish immediately after the final assembly at approx. 12:00 midday. If you have an After School Care booking on the last day, please let the supervisor know if your child needs care on the last afternoon.
