There have been lots of new books on display in the library during Term 1. Hopefully, your child has brought one home to read and/or share with you.

This week's new books have ranged from a rugby cookbook and an atlas to a sophisticated picture book about a lone soldier statue that ties in with the upcoming ANZAC Day. Our older students have been introduced to Morris Gleitzman's Once series which is initially set in Poland during World War II. Our new books this week have also covered gender diversity, a ship-wreck, a goalie, a dystopian world where you can hear each other's thoughts, and a book about your place in the Universe.
