Information Sharing Interviews

An email was sent out last week for bookings to be made for Term 3 Information Sharing Interviews. These interviews will take place at school in your child's classroom, or via phone, and all parents/caregivers are encouraged to attend.

If you haven't already done so please schedule a time with your child's teacher so they can share a picture of your child's current achievement, discuss next steps, and how you can help at home. Mid-year reports will be emailed home on Monday 1 August. Please take the time to read these prior to your child's interview.

- Interviews are 15 minutes in length. The first block of interviews is from 3:15pm to 5:00pm and the second block is from 5:45pm to 7:45pm.
- Students are welcome to attend with their parents/caregivers.
- To ensure everyone's safety and meet the current guidance, caregivers attending an on-site interview will need to wear a mask, maintain a 1-metre distance from other families while waiting to go into their interview, and sanitise as they enter/exit the classrooms.
- If you do not feel comfortable coming into school for your meeting please select the phone option when you are booking your interview(s) and your child's teacher will call you for a phone interview at the allotted time. They will also call you if you are isolating at the time of the interviews.

School Donations

Last year your donations meant we could purchase 50 student Chromebooks, expand the catalogue of books in Te Korowai Manaaki, our new library, to engage and encourage all our readers, and provide additional reading recovery and teacher aide hours to support our students.

The school is primarily funded by the Ministry of Education. They cover our basic needs of staffing, property, and educational and administrative resources. There is very little scope for cost savings or redirecting ministry funding to cover any extras. Any additional resources are over to us.

As you are aware, COVID has had a significant effect on our PTA being able to fundraise. COVID will impact these efforts again this year, so we have had to cut back on teacher aide time and technology replacement to balance our budget. That means donations this year are even more important to our school, and the greater the generosity, the more we can offer our students.

In 2019 the government announced a policy to fund decile 1-7 schools \$150 per student if schools didn't ask their parents for a donation. This policy is currently **not** available to us as we are a decile 10 school.

In line with the government donation scheme the suggested donation this year is \$150 per student. As it is a donation the amount is up to you and voluntary. If this amount is a stretch feel free to adjust it accordingly. At the same time if you feel you could contribute more, please also feel free to adjust the amount. The school office will generate a tax receipt for any donation amount of which you can then claim 1/3 back from the IRD.

Payments can be made:

- At the school office via Eftpos or by credit card
- By direct credit to the school bank account. Please clearly state your child's surname, DONATION, and your 4 digit parent account number. Plimmerton School Board of Trustees: 12-3478-0062343-00
- Alternatively, please complete the <u>School Donations form</u> on our school website to request payment of the donation via your parent account you can then pay this off over the next few weeks.

School Board Parent Election 2022 - Nomination Round


Our school is undertaking a parent election for our School Board. This process has started with the issuing of nomination papers to our caregiver community. We have employed CES to undertake the election process on our behalf. This year with legislative change, our nomination form and full instructions on how to place your nomination into our own School's Election website will be emailed to you if we have your email address in our database or you will receive it by post if we don't have your email in our database. Nomination papers will also be available at the school office. The school will send those on to CES for processing upon receipt from candidates.

Nominations close on Wednesday 3 August at 12 noon. Election day is Wednesday 7th September. We look forward to your participation in this process.

Library Corner

Welcome back to term 3 - a very exciting term for our library!

We will be holding a Book Week during week 9 of this term. Book Week will include a week long Book Fair and, on Friday 23 September, a school wide Interaction Day, for which students will be encouraged to dress up as their favourite book character - there will be prizes to win across all syndicates for creativity and originality. To round off our Book Week activities we have a celebrated author/illustrator visiting on the last Monday of this term.



In addition, the annual Hongoeka and Taupō syndicate persuasive essay writing competition will be held this term. Our senior students are encouraged to write an essay promoting a book of their choice to the library (that is not currently in our collection). The top two essay writers from Hongoeka and Taupō syndicates will be awarded a \$25 book voucher and their recommended books will be purchased for the library.
