Important Information

Communication

Communication from school will be sent by email, the school app and is on the website.

Staff are generally available before and after school if you have any questions or queries. We start teaching at 8.55am.

Please ask or email for an appointment if you need one.

Please do talk to us, we would rather sort out any queries or problems before they become bigger. It is also helpful for us to know of any significant events happening at home that may affect your child at school.

Seesaw

Seesaw is a digital portfolio where we share what your child is learning at school. It's really exciting for students when they receive feedback on what they share so please check in when you can! Your class teacher will get in touch on how to join the journey!



Please remember up to 10 family members can sign up, there is also an option to translate text in 55 languages.

Arriving at School

It is important that your child is at school on time each day.

The first bell rings at 8.55am. Arriving before this bell gives children time to put their belongings in the correct places themselves, and have time to settle in for the day ahead.

SCHOOL OPENING TIME FOR STUDENT ARRIVAL - Students should arrive at school after 8.30am. There is an 8.30am bell. While many teachers are at school before that time, they are busy preparing for the day or in meetings and are often not in the classroom. This means we are not able to supervise students before 8.30am.

Homework

Homework to support your child's learning in Structured Literacy is in their homework book. There will be a one page sheet of homework each week to practise what they have learnt in class. Please send the homework book back to school each day and encourage your child to be independent and responsible for their bookbag.



Please continue to read to your children as well. This is a great opportunity to model good reading, develop comprehension, extend vocabulary and instill a love of books. Remember - there is no app to replace your lap!

Regularly practising number knowledge is important as this is key to making progress in mathematics.

Snack time

Each class has a snack time around 10am to keep our brains ticking. Your child will need a snack of fruit, nuts or

vegetables each day. It may be worth putting this in a separate container.



Water Bottles

Please ensure your child brings a named water bottle each day.

Toys & Valuables

We encourage children to bring resources to support studies and programmes but **please do not bring toys or valuable equipment to school** as we are unable to accept responsibility in the event of breakage or loss.

Lost Property

Please make sure that all clothes, hats and belongings are clearly labelled with your child's name. Lost property is located in front of the school office.



Swimming

The pool is back up and running. We will be swimming in weeks 1 & 2 and 6 & 7 and then in week 8 we will have a water awareness week. We will be swimming 3x a week. Could you please encourage your child to independently change as this is a big help to a successful swimming programme. We will need parent help for this so please let your child's classroom teacher know if you can help.

How you can help:

- putting books away each week. This is a really big help!!
- by helping with the making, maintenance and storage of resources
- by accompanying your child's class on trips
- by supporting the Parent Teacher Association
- by sharing your special skills, talents or interests

Please discuss with your child's teacher the most appropriate times for parent help.

Parents are reminded that information acquired whilst assisting a class is confidential.

Sunsmart - Slip, Slop, Slap

Children are required to wear sun hats and sunsmart tops outside the classroom during terms one and four. The hat needs to cover the ears and back of the neck. Shoulders need to be covered. Please apply sunscreen before school. There is sunscreen available at school for reapplying. Plimmerton School hats are available for purchase at the office.

Our Learning

Our topic for this term will be 'keeping ourselves fit and healthy'. We are lucky enough to have a class set of New World little gardens so this will be our focus on keeping ourselves healthy. We have also

signed up to Zespri young and healthy and they have provided us with pedometers so we will be tracking our steps each day and entering our results so we can see how far we walk over a term.

We are continuing our journey of the iDeal Structured Literacy Programme to teach foundation literacy skills. There is lots of information and videos on the website to get yourself familiar with Structured Literacy.
