Term 4 Pōwhiri

We will be having a pōwhiri on Tuesday 1 November at 9.15am. New students and their whānau will be formally welcomed to the school. Invitations to attend will be sent home to the whānau of newcomers (manuhiri). If you or your child have missed being welcomed at a previous pōwhiri, then you are most welcome to come and join the pōwhiri with the group being welcomed into the school. Also any parents or family members who have been previously welcomed (tangata whenua) are most welcome to attend to help us welcome our new families. The Pōwhiri will be followed by morning tea for the manuhiri.

PB4L at Plimmerton School

Plimmerton School is a PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) school. The aim of PB4L is to develop a positive and supportive school environment for personal, social and academic growth of students and staff. PB4L is not about changing the students; it's about changing the environment, systems and practices schools have in place to support children to make positive behaviour choices. PB4L is based on the Positive Behavioural Interventions and Supports (PBIS) framework developed at the University of Oregon in the 1990s and is currently used in 1050 schools in New Zealand.

At the beginning of Plimmerton School's PB4L journey the staff developed a PB4L mission statement:

'Together we teach and promote positive behaviours that foster kindness, empathy, gratitude, respect and resilience to grow great citizens.'

From this, we developed four overarching values to support the mission statement.



During the day teachers recognise children who are displaying these values by giving out values cards in the playground and at syndicate events. At mid term and, at the end of each term, the class in each syndicate with the most values cards earns a reward.

This term a whole school initiative has been introduced which focuses on one specific behaviour for two weeks at a time. This is designed to be a quick way for staff to acknowledge and reinforce appropriate behaviour at Plimmerton School. We are calling it Plimmerton Gems.


Gala Items Drop-off

(If you can bring a spade it would help)


