Mai e te Tumuaki - From the Principal

Kia ora whānau

Firstly thank you to each and everyone one of you for your understanding with the NZEI and PPTA Industrial action (Strike) which occurred on Thursday 16 March. The media like to portray the issue as teachers wanting increased wages. Yes, that is part of the negotiation. However, a lack of government funding has meant that we no longer have the support we need to make sure every child has access to quality education. If we are going to ensure that all tamariki in Aotearoa can reach their potential in primary schools and Kura Kaupapa Māori, fundamental changes to education must be implemented.

As teachers and principals, we love what we do and always put the needs of our students first. In 2019, we took steps towards a fairer, better resourced primary education sector. Whilst we made some progress, we always knew there was still so much work to be done. The big issue that the government is not willing to address is the work conditions and parity of staffing levels that exist between primary and secondary schools.

The model used to determine staffing levels has been in place for 25 years. The urgent need for fundamental changes was highlighted in the 2021 Pūaotanga report. The Wāwāhi Tahā campaign calls on the Ministry of Education to implement these changes and to take bold action to ensure that all children have the education they deserve.

Like many schools across New Zealand, Plimmerton School is finding it extremely difficult to recruit quality teachers to educate your children. A decrease in teachers across the country also means that our relief teacher pool has shrunk. Increasingly we have to split classrooms to accommodate teacher illness or absence. We are demanding a pathway to address staffing issues now.

Now let's bring our focus back to celebrating our tamariki at Plimmerton. Firstly there are a few changes to how we 'normally' do things in Term 1.

Firstly on Tuesday 4th April (Week 10) we are 'opening our doors' to the community! We welcome all whānau between 3-5pm to come down to school and have a walk through the classrooms to see and hear what your child/ren have been learning about this term. Come and celebrate the terms learning with your child and their teacher and hear all about what they have learnt, tried, failed or accomplished. As a thank you for coming in make sure you collect a BBQ ticket for a free sausage! Our hard working PTA will be at the BBQ cooking up a sausage sizzle and will also have a stall set up to recruit new members and collect names of people who can help at coming events.

Also on Friday 7th April (Good Friday) whānau will receive their very first learning comment about their child, as a post via HERO. The focus of the post is to tell the social story of your child and what our kaiako have seen of your child at school in Term 1! We won't be holding parent interviews at the end of Term 1 this year but if your child is working below in reading, writing or maths, our kaiako will make contact with you before the end of the term. This is part of the ongoing dialogue you will have throughout the year to create a learning partnership.

In Term 2 whānau will receive a reading, writing and maths post during the term and we will also host whānau meetings at the end of the term to meet face to face. Our goal is to promote a partnership between home and school where whānau feel welcome to contact kaiako and receive honest updates and learning goals. HERO enables

us to provide regular updates of learning progress across the term! Exciting times. Speaking of HERO, thank you to whānau who are now using the app to inform the office of any student lateness, absence or appointments!

PB4L at Plimmerton School



Every fortnight Plimmerton School focuses on a specific skill or expected behaviour from one of our four values.

Children who are seen demonstrating this skill or behaviour are given a Plimmerton Gem which they put in one of 4 containers in the foyer. The containers all have different whole school rewards on them. Every four weeks the gems are counted up and the whole school receives this reward.

The week 7 and 8 focus is **how to work in a group.** Teachers have discussed and modelled what this looks and sounds like in a classroom and are giving out gems when they see children working successfully on their own.

▶ Have a chat with your child about how they are going with this skill and how many gems they have earnt.
