



Mai e te Tumuaki - From the Principal

Kia ora whānau

On a dull day like Friday it was wonderful to see so much colour (pink) across the school. Raising awareness about bullying and normalising what is acceptable and not. As humans we are all guilty of saying the wrong thing from time to time, or allowing our emotions to get the better of us. Sometimes it can be solved with an apology and others it takes a little longer and a different approach to strengthen the relationship again. We see this in our children all the time. They haven't understood the comment or action and how it has impacted the other person(s). Nothing is resolved, so the issue remains in the back of the person's mind, reliving this moment over and over. An old saying I love is "Before you hold a grudge - hold a conversation. It may be a result of a misunderstanding". As a kura this is something that we are going to be working towards supporting our tamariki to understand and develop.

One way to start is by identifying the behaviour. By this I mean separating it into three areas; is it RUDE, is it MEAN, or is it BULLYING. Once we can separate the three then we are able to direct our feedback to these so we don't resort instinctively to 'this is bullying'. We want everyone to be able to understand their actions and the impact it has on others. Once we can do this we can normalise the conversation with each other. This is also relevant to us as parents too. If there is ever a misunderstanding in class between students or the teacher, then go straight to the teacher, ask them for their interpretation of events and understand both points of view.



Thank you to all of the wonderful tamariki who showed strong school values of Whitireiatanga and Manawa Titi on Monday during the cross country. It was wonderful to see our kura full of life with an amazing turn out of whanau to encourage not just their own children but all of the children running. Some students find this experience very daunting, but over came personal barriers, set goals, and show grit and determination to finish the event! It is amazing to watch this resilience in our children! Well done everyone.

Thank you to the many positive comments directed Brendon Cross's way for his organisation, planning and preparation of the event. There were a couple of learning opportunities for us as a result of this event so we will take the opportunity to reflect and plan for those next year. If we ever run an event and you are thinking you should say something positive then don't be afraid to share this via an email! The little comments are often the most appreciated!

In the school holidays we invested a significant amount of money (raised from last year's PTA events) to upgrade the lights in every class across our kura! That was 140 brand new LED lights. Not only are these lights sustainable, eco-friendly, and will last for 20,000 hours... but importantly it is an investment in a safe environment for our learners. No more squinting, no more shaded areas across the class, no more flickering lights! So thank you to everyone for supporting our fundraising efforts across the year. In the near future we will be looking to seek

feedback about projects we can do around the school. The funds will come directly from school donations and PTA raised money! So start thinking about fun things you would like to see at our kura!

Great news! More families will now qualify for Childcare Assistance and the rate will increase for those already qualified. Please note: Subsidies are only available for our Kelly Sports Holiday Programmes.

From 1st April income thresholds for Out of School Care and Recreation (OSCAR) Subsidy will increase following a policy change by the Government. The highest rate for Childcare Assistance increases to \$6.10 an hour per child. Families with a gross weekly income of \$2,755.99 are eligible to apply. The new income thresholds and hourly rates from 1st April 2023 can be found <u>here</u>.

Already receive Childcare Assistance?

You don't have to do anything! Your Childcare Assistance will automatically be reviewed from Monday 3 April 2023 and Kelly Sports will apply the new rate.

You don't need to contact Work and Income unless you have a change in your personal circumstances.

If you don't currently have Childcare Assistance and wish to apply?

- Firstly, request a client number from Work and Income (How to get a client number)
- Then apply online through <u>MyMSD</u>. Work and Income will also check to see if you can get any other help from them based on the answers you give in your application.

Or

Download or ask your local Kelly Sports for an application form. Kelly Sports can assist
with completing your application by filling in the childcare provider section. Once the form
is complete it can be sent to Centralised_Childcare_Reviews@msd.govt.nz.
