Kia ora whānau

As we embark on the final term of this year, it's incredible to reflect on the remarkable journey we've had at Plimmerton School. Term 4 promises to be filled with exciting events, enriching learning experiences, and opportunities for our students to shine brightly. I'm already excited about what 2024 will bring!

In the next couple of weeks, we will share a range of information, including syndicate teacher make-ups and how we are planning to structure classes and learning next year. In a large school there will always be some staff movement so we will also introduce you to some new faces!

We would like to thank everyone who participated in the BOT Strategic review as we look to finalise this document and input the ideas and feedback we received. So watch this space, as 2024 is going to be incredible!

This term, our focus remains on providing a stimulating and supportive learning environment. Our dedicated teachers are planning engaging lessons, interactive activities, and inspiring projects to ensure that every child reaches their full potential.

Last week, we were lucky enough to have Friends of Taupo Swamp(FOTSC) and CRATOS come in with a drone to do a live flyover of Taupō Swamp and our School! CRATOS is a locally-based drone company who are working with FOTSC to map the changes that are occurring in the wetlands. CRATOS launched one of their drones from the Plimmerton Domain and flew it over the local area and swamp. The drone was controlled from inside the school hall and we watched a live feed of its flight. Later in the day classes were able to talk to the drone operators and see the drone up close. We then watched the drone lift a 2 litre milk bottle 115 metres off the ground and drop it on the cricket pitch!







This week the Years 5-8 classes spent time at the Plimmerton Domain investigating features of the swamp in more detail. We were lucky enough to have Natalie Parker who is the Community Engagement Coordinator at Porirua City Council, Mountains to Sea Wellington and a team of volunteers run a number of stations. Students did some planting, visited the MENZ shed, learnt about the local catchment area and learnt how to identify Macroinvertebrates. On Wednesday 25 October it is the Year 1-4s turn to visit the domain. Parents and caregivers are most welcome to come along. Please contact your child's teacher to find out when they are going.

Remember to save the date, 18 November 2023, for our annual School Gala. I look forward to raising money by volunteering in the dunking machine, I'm sure there will be a large queue;) The PTA has worked all year to prepare and plan this day, so please support it. All money raised goes directly back into our school for our tamariki.

Library Corner


"Reading for pleasure is fundamental to complete literacy" (Kate Di Goldi).

Welcome to term 4 with lots of activities planned including issue 7 of Scholastic Book Club, the round robin chess competition, the library survey (what can the library do better to meet the needs of staff and students) and also the opportunity for our leaving staff and students to donate a book to the library inscribed with their name.

But first... I attended the Library Association Conference during the first weekend of the holidays. It was amazing to be in a room with celebrated authors, inspiring presenters and passionate librarians. Speakers included Megan Daley (recipient of the Australian Teacher Librarian of the Year), Alan Dingley (the current Te Awhi Rito NZ Reading Ambassador) and Darryn Joseph and Kate Di Goldi (both published The conference reinforced the importance of reading. Reading not only improves literacy but it is also great for mindfulness and for encouraging kindness, compassion and for appreciating different perspectives. Research continues to show that those who read have massively improved outcomes in terms of literacy and that reading is a powerful tool to escape poverty and build nations of compassionate, well-balanced individuals. So I challenge you to read with your children - 5-10 minutes per day. Make this a MUST DO activity in your household.

I also seemed to have had the midas touch during the conference and won \$200 worth of Super-Readables for our library (thanks Library AV NZ), a book covering roll, a signed book from Darryn Joseph and a LinkTV box.

The acrostic poem (created by myself with more than a little help from ChatGPT) summarises my thoughts about reading.



We have had some fabulous new books these first two weeks of term, including a fiction book about the Titanic (where one of the perspectives is told from a stowaway on-board the Carpathia, which was the first ship to get to the Titanic after it hit the iceberg), a story about how do you forgive yourself when no one else will (The Impossible Story of Hannah Kemp) and a very clever picture book - I See I See by R. Henderson which is a picture book best read with a friend where each reader views the page from a different perspective.

Issue 7 of Scholastic Book Club will have been brought home last week - this is our last book club for the year and I thank you so much for your support throughout 2023. This issue contains some great Christmas books and bargains. If your order is a gift, please let me know and I will store it in the library for collection rather than delivering it to your child's classroom.

Orders for issue 7 must be made by Sunday 22 October and they must be made on-line. The school office will not accept orders. Simply log-in to mybookclub.scholastic.co.nz and click ORDER in the top menu (or REGISTER first to save your details for next time). You then select Plimmerton School and your child's class. Add your child's first name and last initial, and the item numbers from the catalogue.
